Clearfell Harvesting Report – Woodlands – May 2021

Summary

- Gross revenue for the month is **\$73,780.90**
- Costs for the month are **\$124,733.94**
- Net income for the month is **-\$50,953.05**
- Tonnes harvested for the month is **563.86**
- Net income per tonne for the month is **-\$90.36**
- Area cleared for the month is **0** hectares

The project performance to date is set out below:

- Project gross revenue to date is **\$15,029,052.70**
- Project costs to date are **\$10,046,136.16**
- Project net income to date is **\$4,982,916.54**
- Tonnes harvested to date is **113,983.34**
- Net income per tonne to date is **\$43.72**
- Recoverable volume per hectare to date is **744** tonnes
- Net income per hectare to date is **32,525.56**
- Total forest area is **306.6** hectares, approximate hectares cleared to date is **153.2** hectares.

The total forest area reflects all net stocked areas regardless of age class or previous roadline volumes.

NB: Measured harvest areas are estimated monthly and reconciled with satellite imagery prior to valuations, they are subject to change and should be used as a guide only.

Revenue

Log Sales

Gross income for the month was **\$73,780.90** with an average sale price over all grades of **\$130.85** per tonne.

Log Markets

March 2021 - Log Markets, Hawkes Bay

The May export prices have lifted \$4.57/Jas m³ on average. The increase has mainly benefited the sawlog log grades.

Radiata log inventories on the main Chinese ports we monitor have fallen further to 3.68Mm³, with daily offtake recovering towards the 80Km³ per day range following the May Day holidays. The inventory supply and demand equation continues to support US\$ CFR pricing at current record levels.

Chinese demand is forecast to remain positive. Construction activity generally slows down in China as they enter the hot season months, June to August. This will be partially offset by reduced harvest volumes during the New Zealand winter. This is not expected to result in any significant inventory build over this period. Customers for New Zealand logs are pushing for more cargo as New Zealand is seen as the most reliable major softwood supply region.

While the heat may be taken out of the log market there is unlikely to be a crash in log prices as supply is still constrained and this will keep upward pressure on CFR pricing. There is unlikely to be an increase in log supply from Europe until more containers become available. North America is in a building boom and has its own shortage of logs and sawn timber. In the short to medium term, there is little chance of supply relief from Australia following their recent withdrawal from the Belt and Road deal with China.

The State Council (China's cabinet) announced in May that it would monitor changes in overseas and domestic markets and will step up coordination between monetary and other policies to maintain stable economic operations. This has been due to concerns of excessive speculation in commodity markets, mainly iron ore.

Ocean freight rates to China have climbed to over US\$50 from most ports. The Chinese government's announcement that it will take as yet unspecified measures to reduce the heat in the commodities market may reduce shipping demand, however, there is still strong demand for bulk shipping of non-commodity items that were previously shipped in containers.

The NZD has bounced around in the 0.712 – 0.73 range during May and continues to hinder gains to New Zealand forest owner from increased CFR log prices in China.

Domestic pruned log prices have lifted \$12 this quarter due to strong AWG export pricing and factoring in the winter effects on Jas conversion.

Grade Recovery

Grade out turn for May is as follows:

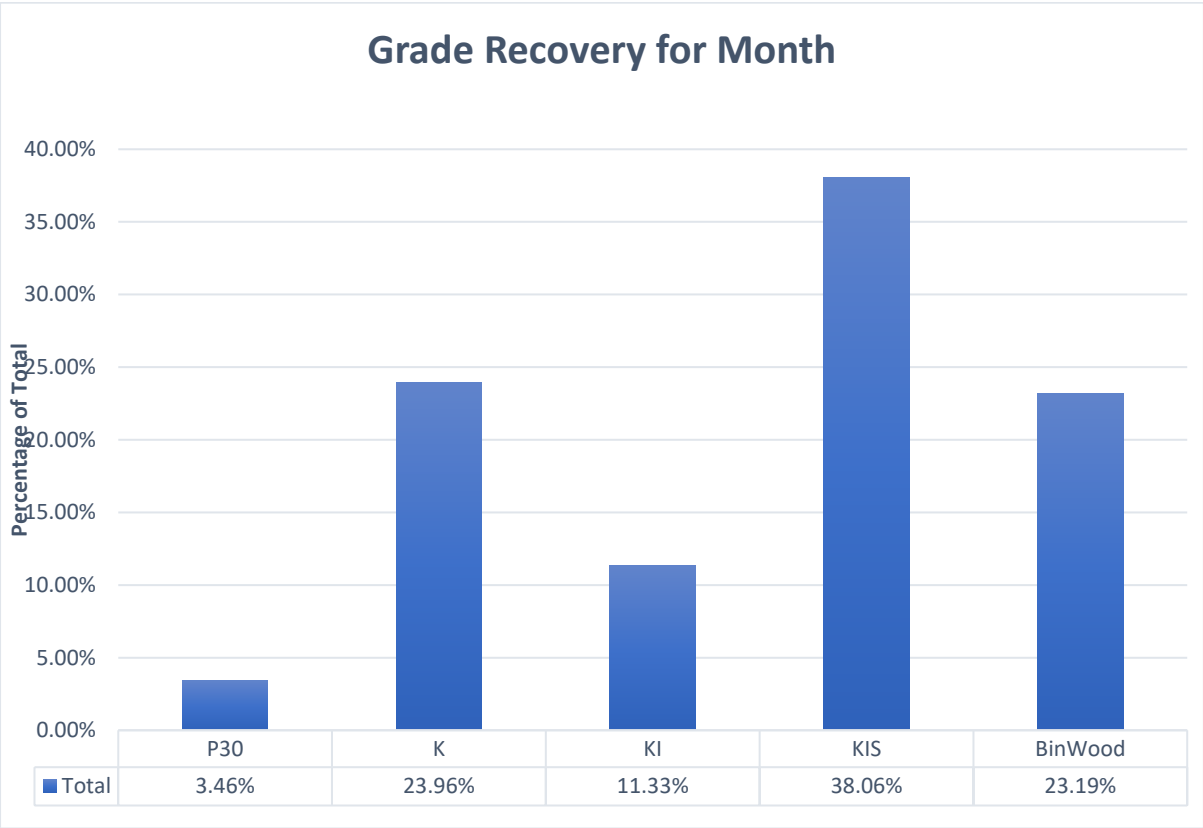


Chart 1: Grade Recovery for Month

Pruned recovery for May comprised 3% of overall sales volume, all of which was sold to the export market

High quality export sawlog (AO, A and K grades) made up 24% of the total production volume, with lower quality export logs (KI and KIS grades) comprising 50% of volume.

The remaining 23% of production was made up of binwood.

The last loads of logs were picked up at the beginning of May and as there is not any more harvesting in Woodlands in the near future, the grade out turn has been influenced by the composition of the last loads.

Cartage

Cartage is managed by Harvest Logistics Ltd, who organise the despatch and supply of log trucks into the forest.

The total cartage expense for the month was **\$16,298.16** which is an average unit rate of **\$28.90** per tonne.

Cartage expenditure for the month is summarised below in Table 2:

Consumable costs are for docket books used for the loadout of logs during May.

Other costs are for the proportional costs of operating the forest digital radio network.

Health and Safety

There were no health and safety incidents reported in the forest during May.

A harvest crew (not involved with Woodlands Forest) travelling home on Putere Road in a light vehicle collided with another light vehicle travelling the other way. This was partly due to poor visibility, a blind corner close to the Waiau Station Road entrance and a very narrow section of the road. Neither driver assumed responsibility for the incident with both claiming the other crossed the centre line. A post incident drug test confirmed the driver was negative for illegal substances.

A meeting was held on 8th June with the Putere community, Wairoa District Council, NZ Police, harvest crews and cartage operators to discuss road use incidences, many of which are affecting the community. Solutions were discussed and a working group for ongoing improvements established.

Environmental

There was no site-specific environmental planning or monitoring undertaken during May.

The orange cumulative line measures actual performance against the forecast budget.

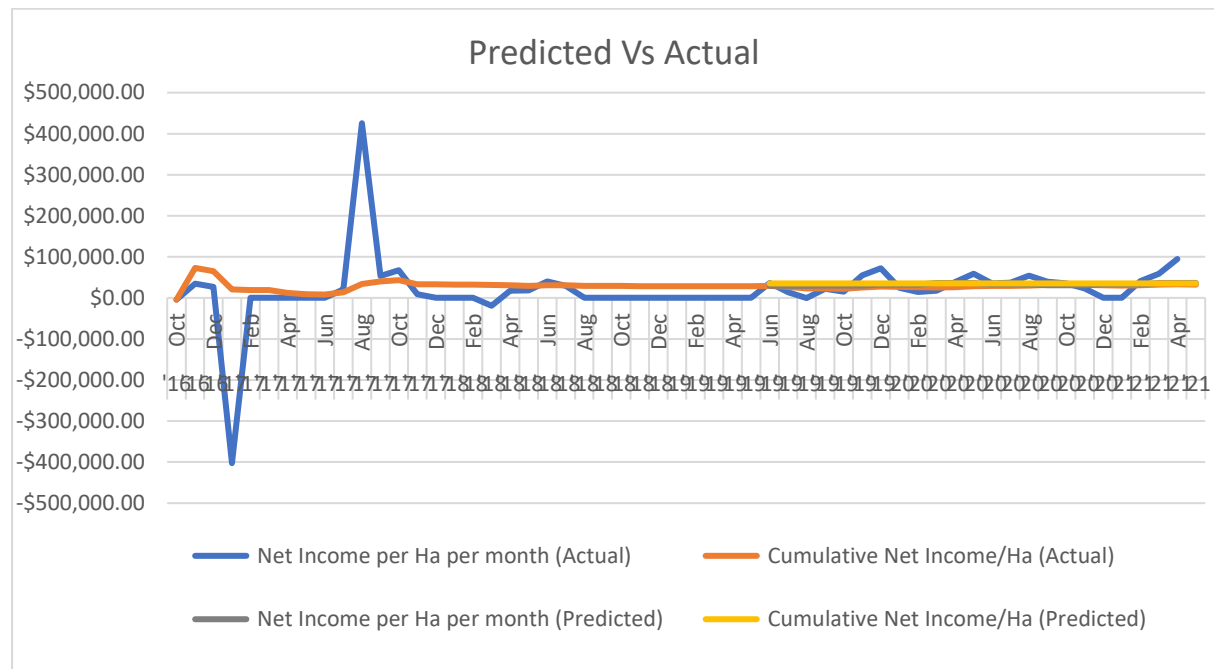


Chart 2: Actual vs Predicted
