Clearfell Harvesting Report – Glenlea – September 2021

Summary

- Gross revenue for the month is **\$523,475.46**
- Costs for the month are **\$370,289.42**
- Net income for the month is **\$153,186.04**
- Tonnes harvested for the month is **3,800.07**
- Net income per tonne for the month is **\$40.31**
- Area cleared for the month is **4** hectares

The project performance to date is set out below:

- Project gross revenue to date is **\$8,853,027.81**
- Project costs to date are **\$6,811,800.80**
- Project net income to date is **\$2,041,227.01**
- Tonnes harvested to date is **67,715.1**
- Net income per tonne to date is **\$30.14**
- Recoverable volume per hectare to date is **740.1** tonnes
- Net income per hectare to date is **\$22,308.49**
- Total forest area is **293.80** hectares, approximate hectares cleared to date is **91.5** hectares.

The total forest area reflects all net stocked areas regardless of age class or previous roadline volumes.

NB: Measured harvest areas are estimated monthly and reconciled with satellite imagery prior to valuations, they are subject to change and should be used as a guide only.

Revenue

Log Sales

Gross income for the month was **\$523,475.46** with an average sale price over all grades of **\$137.75** per tonne.

September 2021 - Log Markets, Hawkes Bay

The September export prices have remained flat at \$0.64/Jas m³ on average. The slight increase has been to the pruned grades.

Radiata log inventories on the main Chinese ports we monitor have increased again to 4.75Mm³, with daily offtake 73Km³ per day range. For the market to show any strength, we need an increase in demand and a downward inventory trend.

The outlook for Chinese port inventories is not great for this time of the of year. Current on port volumes haven't changed much from the previous month, with a significant amount on the water awaiting discharge at ports.

There is concern for the property sector in China as property developer Evergrande faces the risk of default. The company currently has 778 projects underway in 223 cities. The property sector contributes 28% of the Chinese economy and is seen as key to China's economic development. Even if the Chinese Government opts to let Evergrande default rather than bail it out directly, authorities are likely to be involved in coordinating the continuation of these projects that employ 163,000 people.

Shipping congestion in China has reached the point where nearly 10% of the worlds' handy sized fleet capacity were queuing off the China coast. This has two effects, high demurrage and reduced capacity. The congestion has been caused by Chinese authorities reacting to Covid outbreaks by closing ports, delaying berthing, and imposing strict procedures that have reduced ship handling capacity. There has also been strong demand for grain, minerals and iron ore imports.

The NZD remained relatively unchanged from the end of August through to end of September (0.6972 – 0.7039) having little impact on AWG pricing.

Domestic pruned log prices have lifted \$4 this quarter due to strong AWG export pricing and factoring in the winter effects on Jas conversions.

Grade Recovery

Grade out turn for September is as follows:

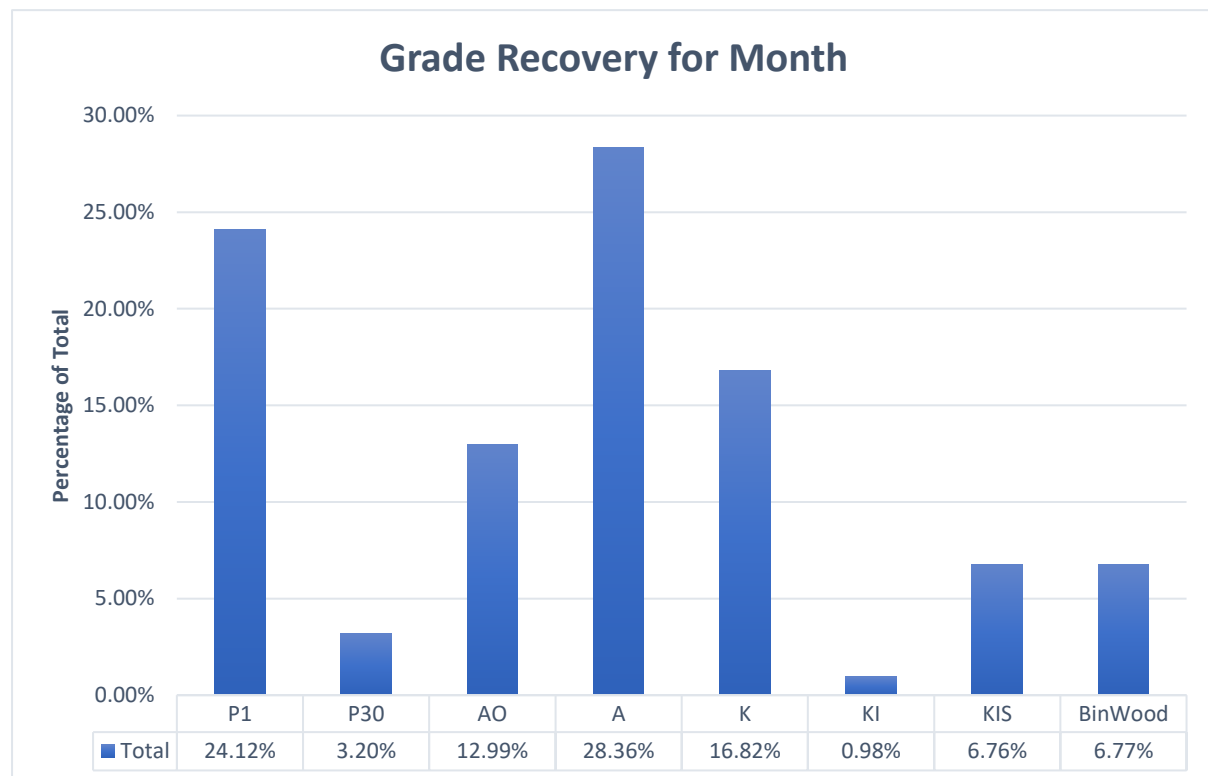


Chart 1: Grade Recovery for Month

Pruned recovery for September comprised 27% of overall sales volume, 24% of which was sold as domestic pruned grades.

High quality export sawlog (AO, A and K grades) made up 58% of the total production volume, with lower quality export (KI and KIS grades) comprising 8% of volume.

The remaining 7% of production was made up of domestic pulp and binwood.

Expenditure

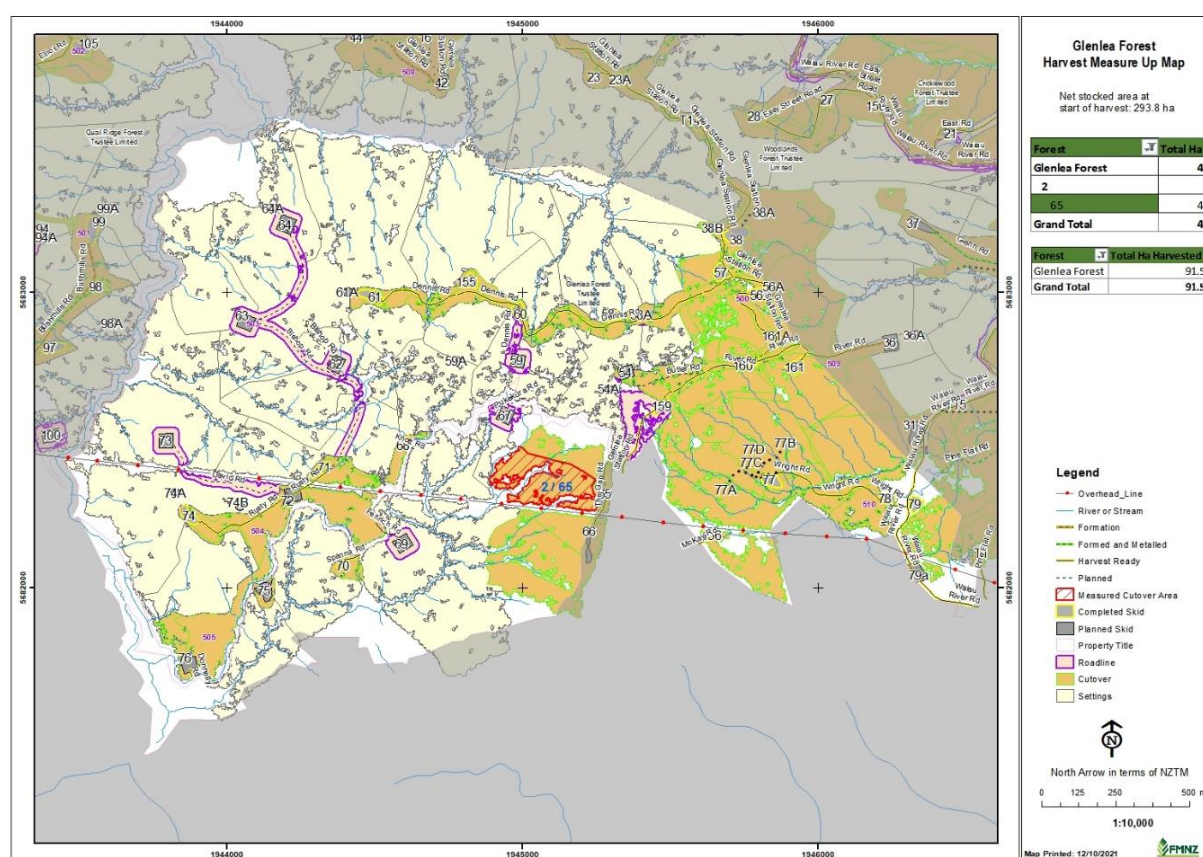
Harvesting

The total logging cost for the month was **\$157,483.73**, an average of **\$41.44** per tonne.

At the beginning of September, the felling around the power lines in Setting 65 was completed. This setting had nice wood and produced plenty of Pan Pac grades. The harvest crew then moved to neighbouring Woodlands Forest for a few weeks to complete a setting which was extensively damaged by the high winds the area has recently had. Once that has been completed the hauler will return to Landing 69 on Putere Road.

Cartage

Cartage is managed by Harvest Logistics Ltd, who organise the despatch and supply of log trucks into the forest.

The total cartage expense for the month was **\$116,044.97** which is an average unit rate of **\$30.54** per tonne.

Cartage expenditure for the month is summarised below in Table 2:

The average cart rate for September inclusive of weighbridge and trans-shipping fees is **\$30.93** per tonne.

Trans-shipping is the accumulating of logs from completed settings which could not be made up into full packets and moving these logs to the current setting for loadout and sale. The logs normally number 10 of this and 12 of that but are still product for sale.

During September, work was undertaken on Fenrich Road (Landing 69) and McDell Road (Landing 75). Both of these are short stab roads directly off Putere Road.

Rehabilitation was completed on Gap Road following the harvest of Setting 65.

Planned Activities for October 2021

During October, the harvesting crew with some additional equipment will roadline Rusty Road from Landing 71 heading towards Landing 62. The hauler crew will move back to Glenlea Forest to Setting 69.

Planned engineering work in October includes metalling Fenrich and McDell Roads.

Net Revenue

Net revenue for the project to date excluding GST is shown in Table 4 below:

The orange cumulative line measures actual performance against the forecast budget.

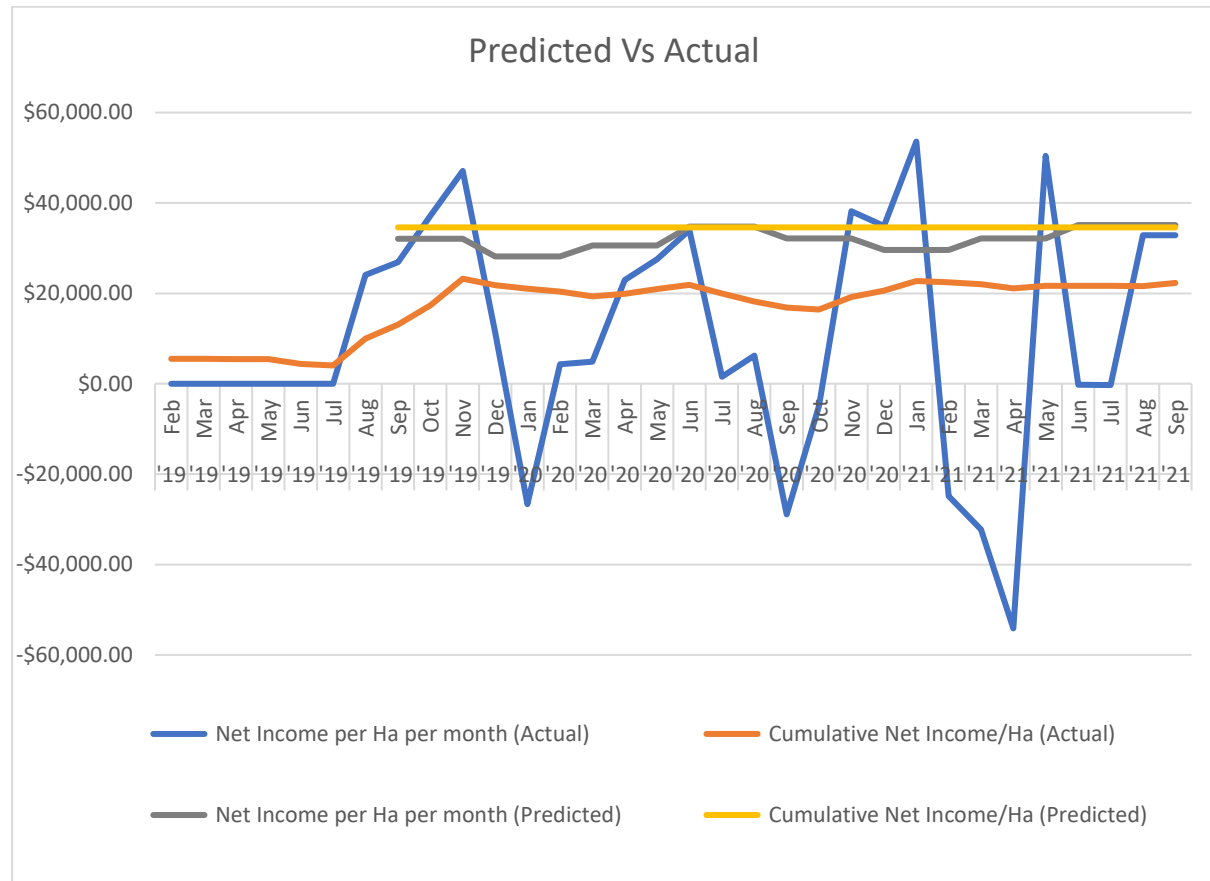


Chart 2: Actual vs Predicted
