Clearfell Harvesting Report – Quail Ridge – September 2021

Summary

- Gross revenue for the month is **\$1,334,391.27**
- Costs for the month are **\$841,980.22**
- Net income for the month is **\$492,411.05**
- Tonnes harvested for the month is **9,412.27**
- Net income per tonne for the month is **\$52.32**
- Area cleared for the month is **8.9** hectares

The project performance to date is set out below:

- Project gross revenue to date is **\$12,658,857.54**
- Project costs to date are **\$8,631,746.29**
- Project net income to date is **\$4,027,111.24**
- Tonnes harvested to date is **84,441.79**
- Net income per tonne to date is **\$47.69**
- Recoverable volume per hectare to date is **771.2** tonnes
- Net income per hectare to date is **\$36,777.27**
- Total forest area is **225.4** hectares, approximate hectares cleared to date is **109.5** hectares.

The total forest area reflects all net stocked areas regardless of age class or previous roadline volumes.

NB: Measured harvest areas are estimated monthly and reconciled with satellite imagery prior to valuations, they are subject to change and should be used as a guide only.

Revenue

Log Sales

Gross income for the month was **\$1,334,391.27** with an average sale price over all grades of **\$141.77** per tonne.

September 2021 - Log Markets, Hawkes Bay

The September export prices have remained flat at \$0.64/Jas m³ on average. The slight increase has been to the pruned grades.

Radiata log inventories on the main Chinese ports we monitor have increased again to 4.75Mm³, with daily offtake 73Km³ per day range. For the market to show any strength, we need an increase in demand and a downward inventory trend.

The outlook for Chinese port inventories is not great for this time of the of year. Current on port volumes haven't changed much from the previous month, with a significant amount on the water awaiting discharge at ports.

There is concern for the property sector in China as property developer Evergrande faces the risk of default. The company currently has 778 projects underway in 223 cities. The property sector contributes 28% of the Chinese economy and is seen as key to China's economic development. Even if the Chinese Government opts to let Evergrande default rather than bail it out directly, authorities are likely to be involved in coordinating the continuation of these projects that employ 163,000 people.

Shipping congestion in China has reached the point where nearly 10% of the worlds' handy sized fleet capacity were queuing off the China coast. This has two effects, high demurrage and reduced capacity. The congestion has been caused by Chinese authorities reacting to Covid outbreaks by closing ports, delaying berthing, and imposing strict procedures that have reduced ship handling capacity. There has also been strong demand for grain, minerals and iron ore imports.

The NZD remained relatively unchanged from the end of August through to end of September (0.6972 – 0.7039) having little impact on AWG pricing.

Domestic pruned log prices have lifted \$4 this quarter due to strong AWG export pricing and factoring in the winter effects on Jas conversions.

Grade Recovery

Grade out turn for September is as follows:

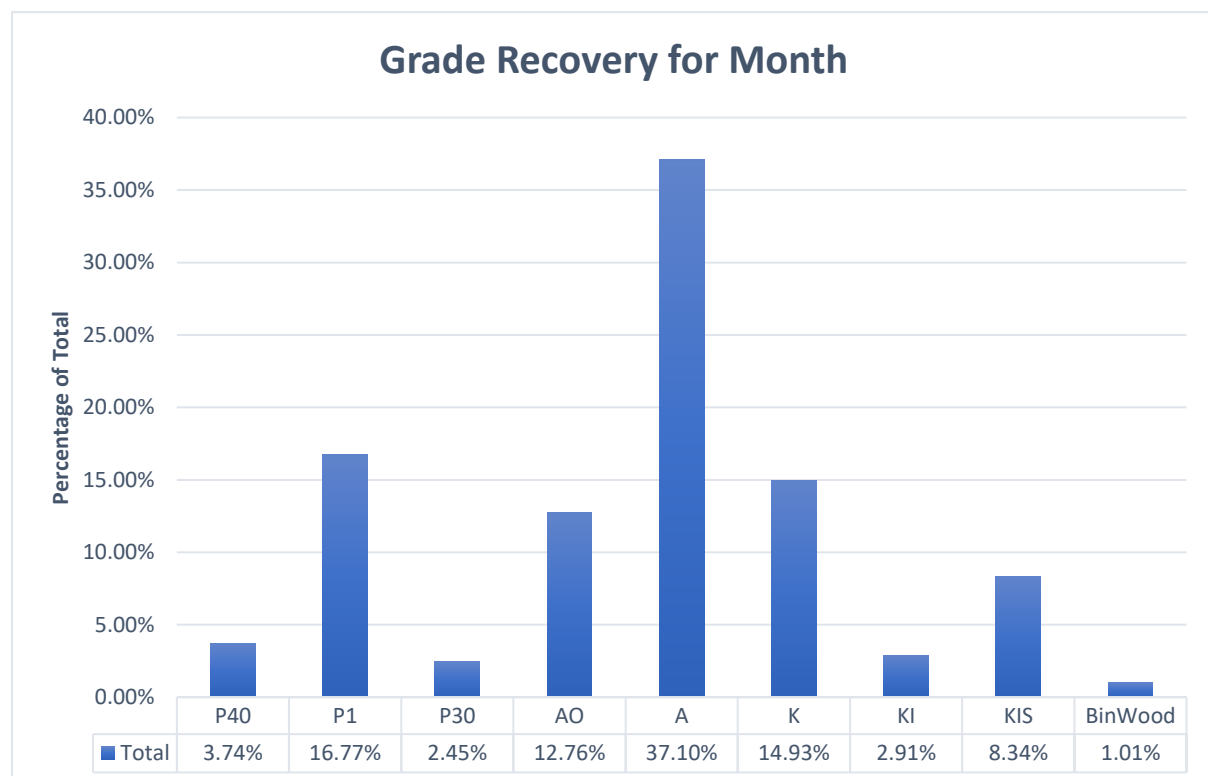


Chart 1: Grade Recovery for Month

Pruned recovery for September comprised 23% of overall sales volume, 17% of which was sold as domestic pruned grades.

High quality export sawlog (AO, A and K grades) made up 65% of the total production volume, with lower quality export (KI and KIS grades) comprising 11% of volume.

The remaining 1% of production was made up of domestic pulp and binwood.

Expenditure

Harvesting

The total logging cost for the month was **\$398,452.41**, an average of **\$42.33** per tonne.

There was a daily logging cost for the felling machine which was tethered with assistance from a manual faller (hourly logging cost) to carry out emergency felling of the windblown trees and powerline trees in Setting 83. This was required after strong winds had uprooted trees into the powerlines which had interrupted the domestic power supply for three days.

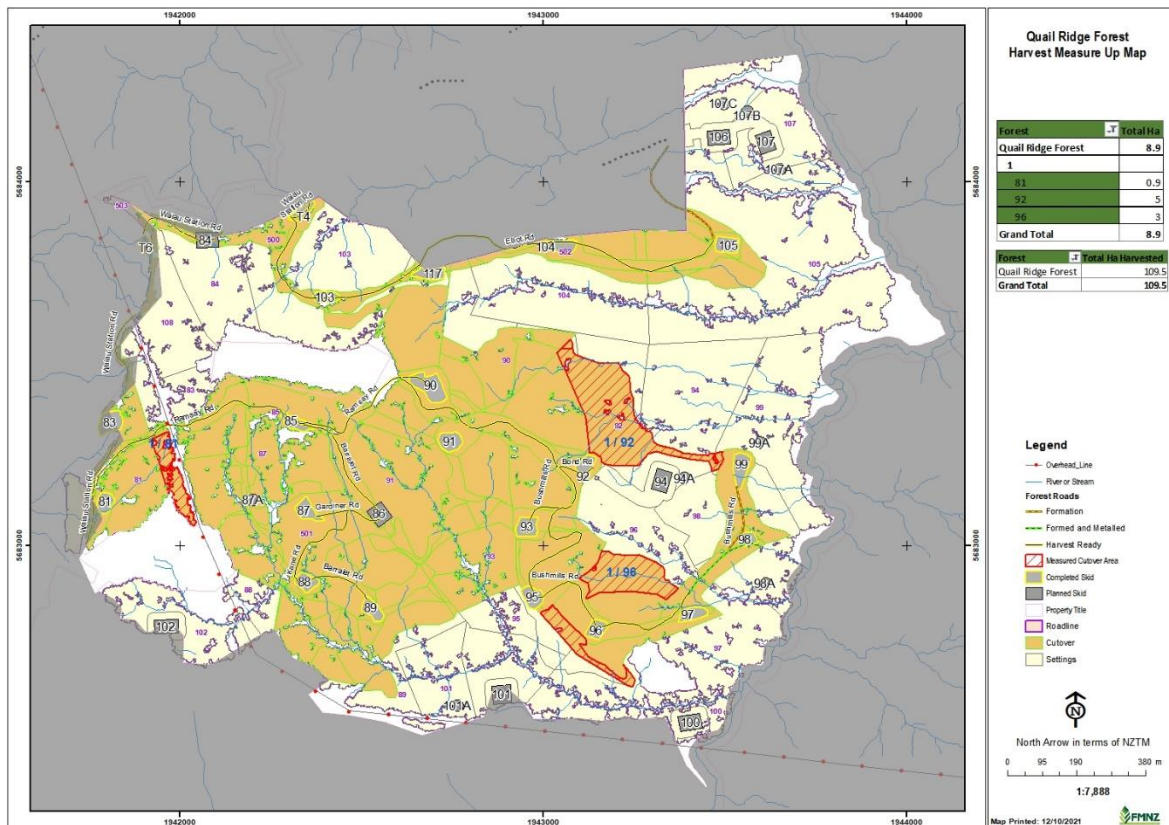

Tracking costs were for access required for the harvest crew to clear trees from beside a water course and for access under the power lines to extract the felled trees.

Log 5 continued clearfell harvesting in Setting 92 during September.

Log 58 completed clearfell harvesting in Setting 96 and at the end of the month they moved to Setting 98 to fall the strip next to the road and cut the hauler pad.

Cartage

Cartage is managed by Harvest Logistics Ltd, who organise the despatch and supply of log trucks into the forest.

The total cartage expense for the month was **\$306,872.76** which is an average unit rate of **\$32.60** per tonne.

The average cart rate for September inclusive of weighbridge and trailer lifting fees is **\$32.92** per tonne.

Trailer lifting costs are for use of the public gantry to reload trailers for loads delivered outside the normal hours of the facility provided by the Napier Port.

Work was completed on Bushmills and Trewavas Roads to facilitate harvest operations in September. Maintenance work was required on, Bond, Kane and Waiau Station Roads.

Planned Activities for October 2021

Planned activities for October are for Log 5 to continue clearfelling in Settings 90, 92, and 99, and will then move to Elliott Road to pull Setting 117.

Log 58 will complete clearfelling of the Landing 98 pad and then move to Landing 97 to harvest down to the Pukematai Stream before moving to Setting 101 beside Putere Road to clear the power lines and felling beside Putere Road.

Pavement is planned for Bushmills and Trewavas Roads in October.

The boundary fence with Monarae Station will be renewed after extensive damage during the power line felling.

Net Revenue

Net revenue for the project to date excluding GST is shown in Table 5 below:

Consumable costs are for docket books used for the loadout of logs during September and for antisapstain used to treat the ends of pruned export logs.

Other costs are for the proportional costs of operating the forest digital radio network.

Power Lines costs are for repairs to lines following tree strike, invoiced by the Network Operator.

There were no health and safety incidents reported in the forest during September.

There was no site-specific environmental planning or monitoring undertaken during September.

The orange cumulative line measures actual performance against the forecast budget.

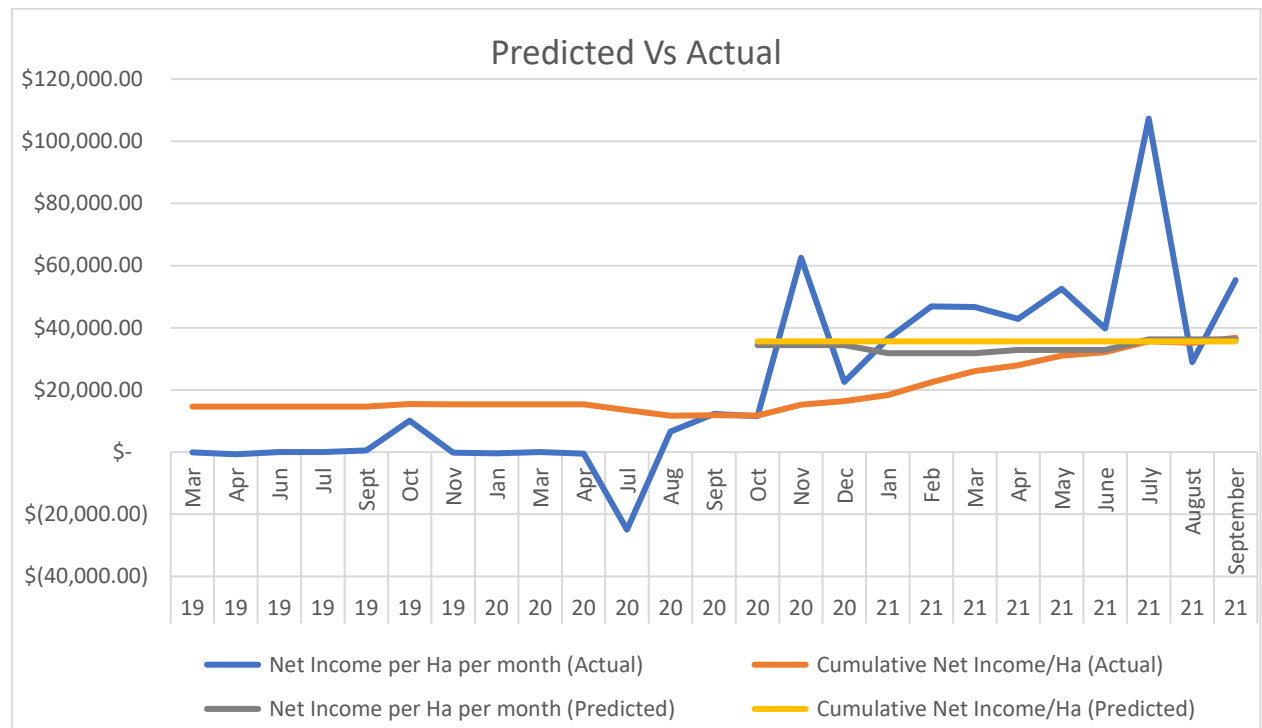


Chart 2: Actual vs Predicted
