Clearfell Harvesting Report – Hereford – October 2021

Summary

- Gross revenue for the month is **\$321,282.17**
- Costs for the month are **\$232,998.77**
- Net income for the month is **\$88,283.40**
- Tonnes harvested for the month is **2,442.56**
- Net income per tonne for the month is **\$36.14**
- Area cleared for the month is **2.30** hectares

The project performance to date is set out below:

- Project gross revenue to date is **\$7,613,934.39**
- Project costs to date are **\$5,885,981.56**
- Project net income to date is **\$1,727,952.83**
- Tonnes harvested to date is **53,991.67**
- Net income per tonne to date is **\$32.00**
- Recoverable volume per hectare to date is **614.9** tonnes
- Net income per hectare to date is **\$19,680.56**
- Total forest area is **180.50** hectares, approximate hectares cleared to date is **87.8** hectares.

The total forest area reflects all net stocked areas regardless of age class or previous roadline volumes.

NB: Measured harvest areas are estimated monthly and reconciled with satellite imagery prior to valuations, they are subject to change and should be used as a guide only.

Revenue

Log Sales

Gross income for the month was **\$321,282.17** with an average sale price over all grades of **\$131.54** per tonne.

October 2021 - Log Markets, Gisborne and Hawkes Bay

The October export prices have increased \$1.30/Jas m³ on average in Gisborne with the increase affecting all log grades. In Hawkes Bay, prices have remained flat with no change to prices.

Radiata log inventories on the main Chinese ports we monitor have increased to 4.77Mm³, with daily offtake in the 79Km³ per day range. While demand has slightly increased from last month, all indicators are that the China economy is slowing with less construction activity.

China is in a state of “Structural Reset”. The Chinese Government has been concerned about the growing gap between the wealthy and the poor in China as this leads to social unrest. They are undertaking wealth redistribution strategies (tax the wealthy etc.) trying to improve the income / lifestyle of the middle class along with reduced property prices.

Credit tightening policies due to large debts in property development as well as property tax changes has seen a lot of new construction stall. Evergrande has restarted some projects as they have bought time to repay some creditors, but still face significant challenges ahead.

The energy crisis in China will have a positive long-term effect on timber demand as China is aware of the higher energy costs of steel and concrete. They are already mandating the use of more wood in their buildings. In the short term this maybe negative, as electricity supply is rationed. The main log processing area affected to date is Taicang, which had already been affected by the Government wanting to repurpose the land these mills occupy.

The freight market has had some downward movement in the big Capesize vessels due to less iron ore demand which is expected to flow on in the smaller handy size vessels used in log exports. Congestion times have reduced significantly but this depends on log berths in Lanshan for competing product demands.

The NZD has continued to rise against the USD since the end of September. This has eroded some AWG value for forest owners.

Domestic pruned log prices have fallen \$1 in Gisborne and \$15 in Hawkes Bay this quarter due to weaker AWG export pricing and factoring in the spring effects on Jas conversions.

Grade Recovery

Grade out turn for October is as follows:

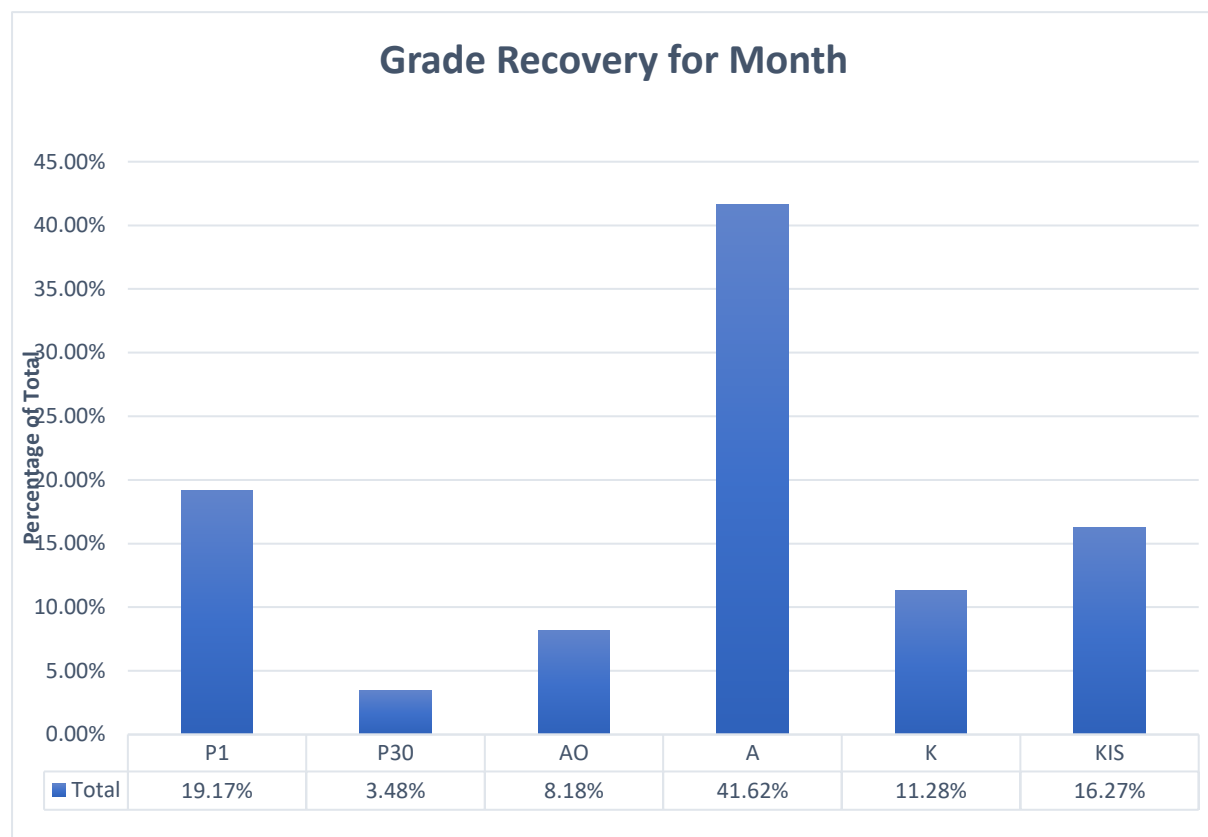


Chart 1: Grade Recovery for Month

Pruned recovery for October comprised 23% of overall sales volume, 20% of which was sold as domestic pruned grades.

High quality export sawlog (AO, A and K grades) made up 61% of the total production volume, with lower quality export (KI and KIS grades) comprising 16% of volume.

There was no pulp or binwood sales.

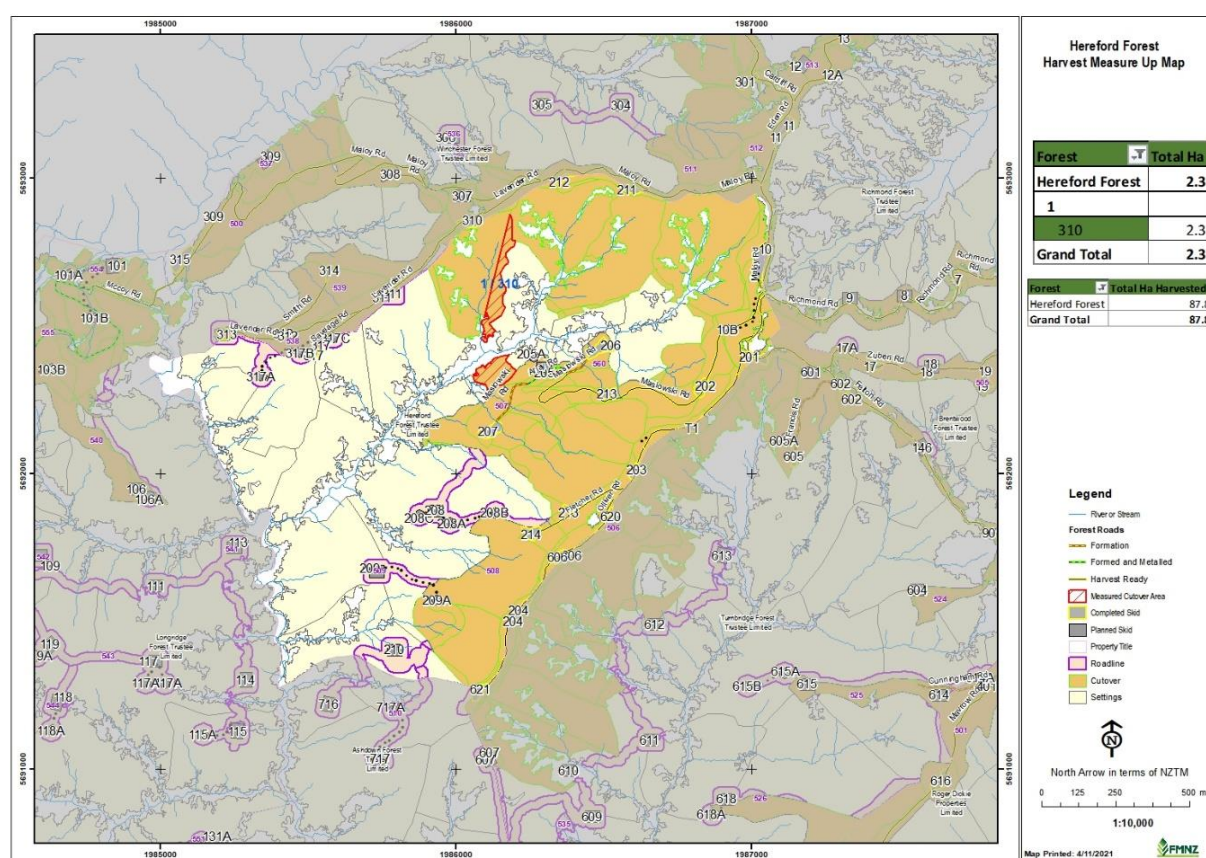
Harvesting

The total logging cost for the month was **\$101,317.39**, an average of **\$41.48** per tonne.

During October, Log 24 completed clearfell harvesting of Setting 310. This wood was loaded onto highway trucks directly from the landing on Lavender Road which is on the boundary of Winchester Forest. The crew then left the forest mid-October to go to neighbouring Brentwood Forest.

Cartage

Cartage is managed by Harvest Logistics Ltd, who organise the despatch and supply of log trucks into the forest.

The total cartage expense for the month was **\$85,544.96** which is an average unit rate of **\$35.02** per tonne.

The average cart rate for October inclusive of weighbridge fees is **\$35.37** per tonne.

Some volume was carted to Gisborne Port and some to the Wairoa Rail Head. The “Cartage Rail” is the cost of cartage by rail only.

Planned Activities for November 2021

Log 24 will return to Hereford Forest around the end of November / December once they have finished clearfelling Setting 19 at neighbouring Brentwood Forest.

Earthworks in November will be limited due to limited harvest funds. Work will be related to prepare for clearfell harvest and enabling clearfell extraction.

Net Revenue

Net revenue for the project to date excluding GST is shown in Table 4 below:

The orange cumulative line measures actual performance against the forecast budget.

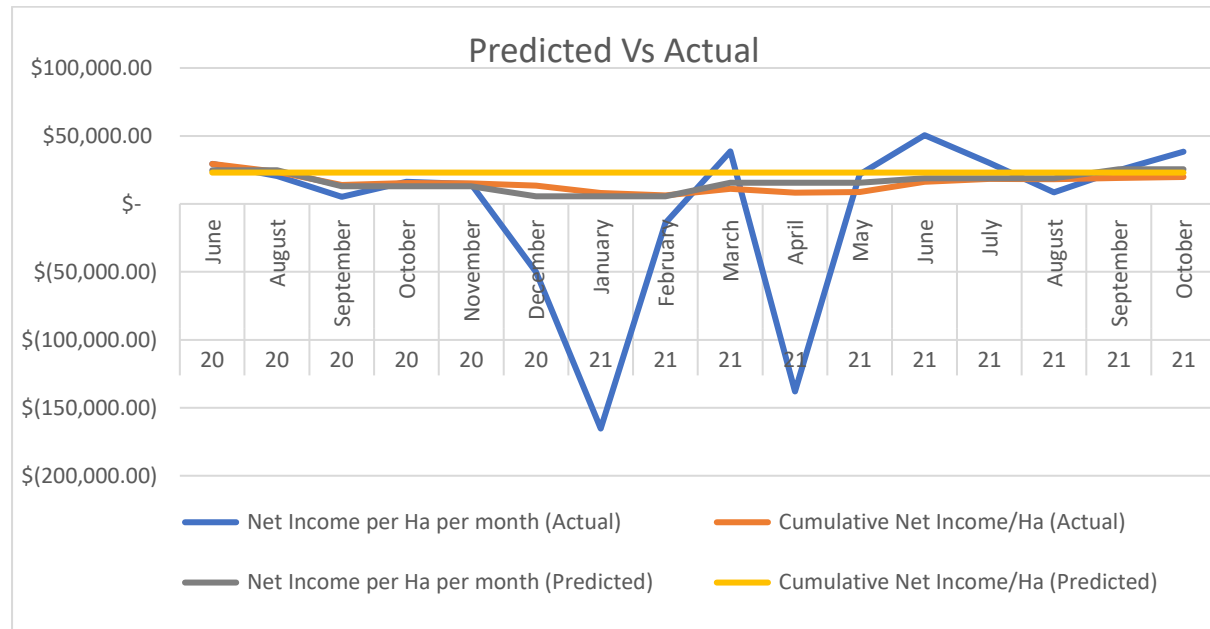


Chart 2: Actual vs Predicted
