Clearfell Harvesting Report – Stoney River – February 2022

Summary

- Gross revenue for the month is **\$611,829.58**
- Costs for the month are **\$411,308.67**
- Net income for the month is **\$200,520.91**
- Tonnes harvested for the month is **4,287.16**
- Net income per tonne for the month is **\$46.77**
- Area cleared for the month is **5.2** hectares

The project performance to date is set out below:

The total forest area reflects all net stocked areas regardless of age class or previous roadline volumes.

NB: Measured harvest areas are estimated monthly and reconciled with satellite imagery prior to valuations, they are subject to change and should be used as a guide only.

Revenue

Log Sales

Gross income for the month was **\$611,829.58** with an average sale price over all grades of **\$142.71** per tonne.

February 2022 - Log Markets, Hawkes Bay

The February export prices have increased \$22.93/Jas m³ on average, with the increases favouring pruned grades.

Radiata log inventories on the main Chinese ports we monitor have increased to 4.1Mm³, with daily offtake down significantly to 20Km³ per day. This was expected because of the Lunar New Year in early February. How the offtake increases will be interesting to see as the full effects of the Evergrande crisis unfold.

Reduced supplies out of New Zealand in the last quarter of 2021 has been key for reengaging Chinese buying, particularly when other parts of the world are offering no more volume than normal. We are seeing both the log and freight markets rise and expect to see increased AWG returns in the short term and then most likely increased volatility as the year progresses. China has now exited the LNY Holiday, and log demand / freight has lifted sharply. The New Zealand share of the China market is likely to increase further in the near term as supply from other major sources remain constrained due to high container costs and complex supply chain issues.

The spread of Omicron continues around the rest of the country, it is expected this will affect staff attendance as they isolate. This may affect log production, cartage, exporting operations as well as domestic sawmilling.

The recent Russian invasion of Ukraine has seen the rapid increase in crude oil prices. This is feeding into ocean freight rates lifting US\$25 since January. Demand for freight is up sharply post LNY as more vessels look to relocate to the Pacific and away from the Atlantic due to concerns regarding the war escalating.

The NZD has continued to trade higher against the USD since the beginning of February.

Mid-quarter, domestic pruned log prices have settled flat, due to concerns relating to the slowdown in harvesting affecting production / supply.

Grade Recovery

Grade out turn for February is as follows:

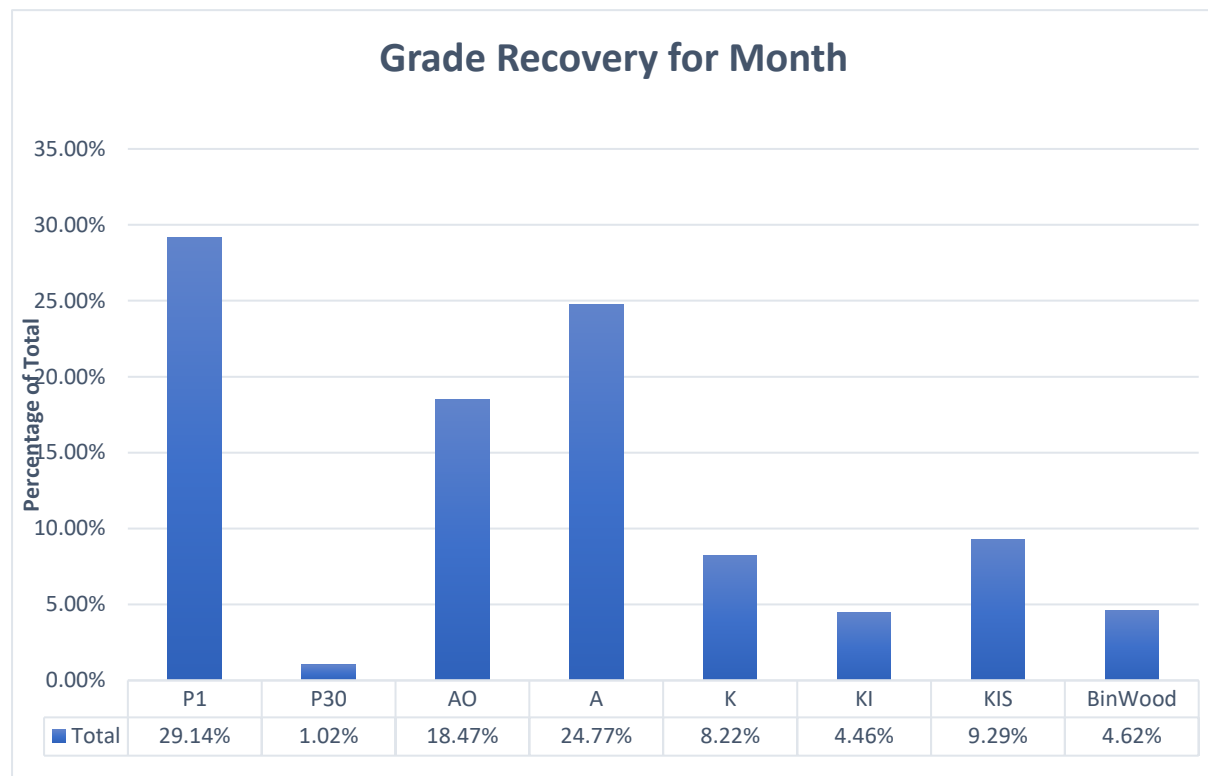


Chart 1: Grade Recovery for Month

Pruned recovery for February comprised 30% of overall sales volume, 29% of which was sold as domestic pruned grades.

High quality export sawlog (AO, A and K grades) made up 51% of the total production volume, with lower quality export (KI and KIS grades) comprising 14% of volume.

The remaining 5% of production was made up of domestic pulp and binwood.

Expenditure

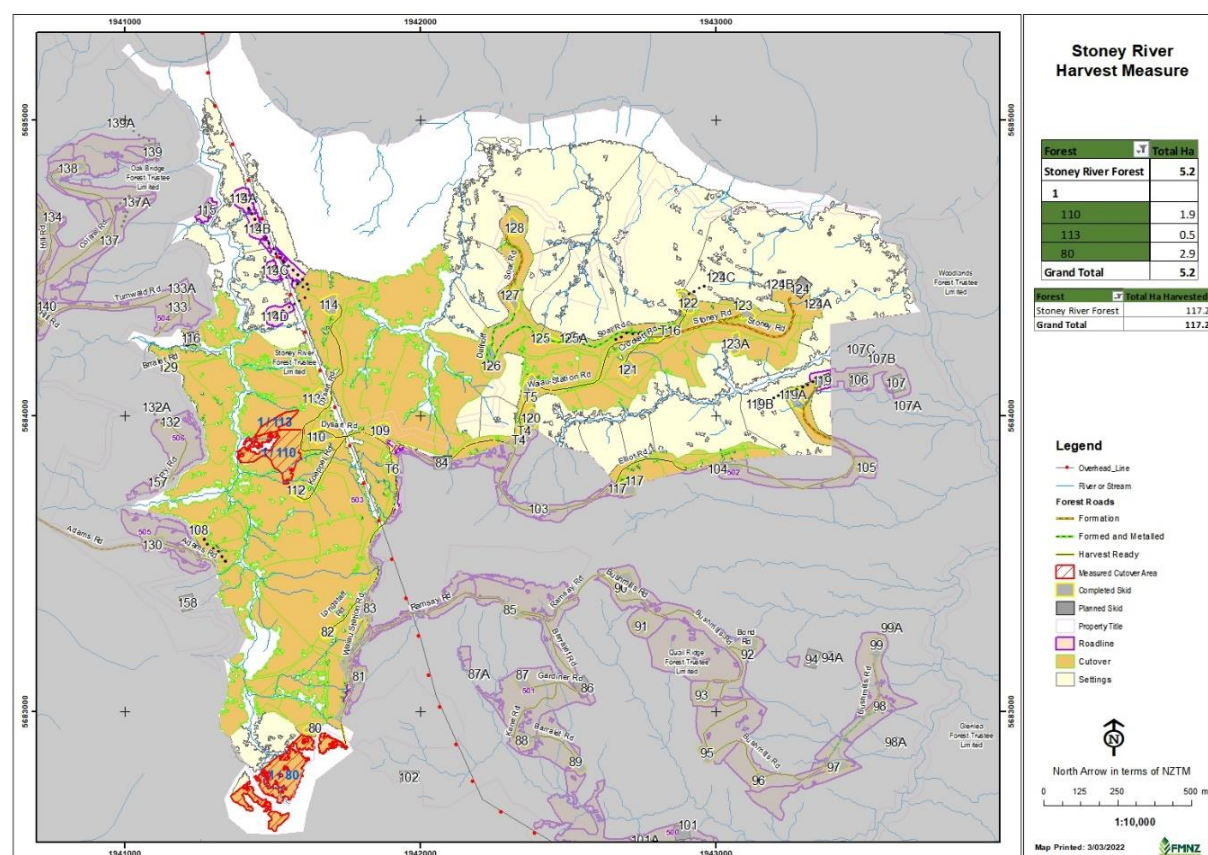
Harvesting

The total logging cost for the month was **\$189,338.46**, an average of **\$44.16** per tonne.

In February the harvest crew moved to Landing 110 on Dysart Road to pull the remainder of the volume from the setting. They also started felling Setting 80 which the hauler moved to after completing Setting 110. Some volume was pulled across Putere Road.

Traffic control was required to manage traffic for both the falling and the harvesting to keep the road open. An excavator was also required for periodic clearing of the road of logging debris to allow other road users to travel past the site.

Cartage

Cartage is managed by Harvest Logistics Ltd, who organise the despatch and supply of log trucks into the forest.

There has been a further increase in transport costs due to the ongoing increase in diesel price.

The total cartage expense for the month was **\$146,185.19** which is an average unit rate of **\$34.10** per tonne.

Cartage expenditure for the month is summarised below in Table 2:

The average cart rate for February inclusive of weighbridge and trailer lifting fees is **\$34.45** per tonne.

Trailer lifting costs are for use of the public gantry to reload trailers for loads delivered outside the normal hours of the facility provided by the Napier Port.

Other costs are for the proportional costs of operating the forest digital radio network.

Consumable costs are for docket books used for the loadout of logs during February and for antisapstain used to treat the ends of pruned export logs.

Power Lines costs are a late invoice from December 2021 for an arborist to fell trees around the power lines and for an observer from Eastland Power while felling trees near power lines at Landing 113.

Traffic management costs are for stop go traffic control while falling within two tree lengths of Putere Road around Setting 80 in February.

Health and Safety

Two property damage incidents were reported in the forest in February.

The first incident occurred while the hauler operator was pulling in a drag with the Falcon Claw carriage when he noticed smoke coming out of the side cover. Once the carriage got close to him he saw flames and then had to dump ropes. The Falcon dropped out of the sky and hit the ground with damage occurring around the covers. The crew immediately put the fire out with an extinguisher. The Claw landed on cut up slash and logs causing dents and cosmetic damage only.

The second incident occurred when the Supervisor left a gate unlatched and a bull got out. They tried to chase it back in but it got past the truck hitting the right side corner. The bull then started charging at the logger's vehicle.

The orange cumulative line measures actual performance against the forecast budget.

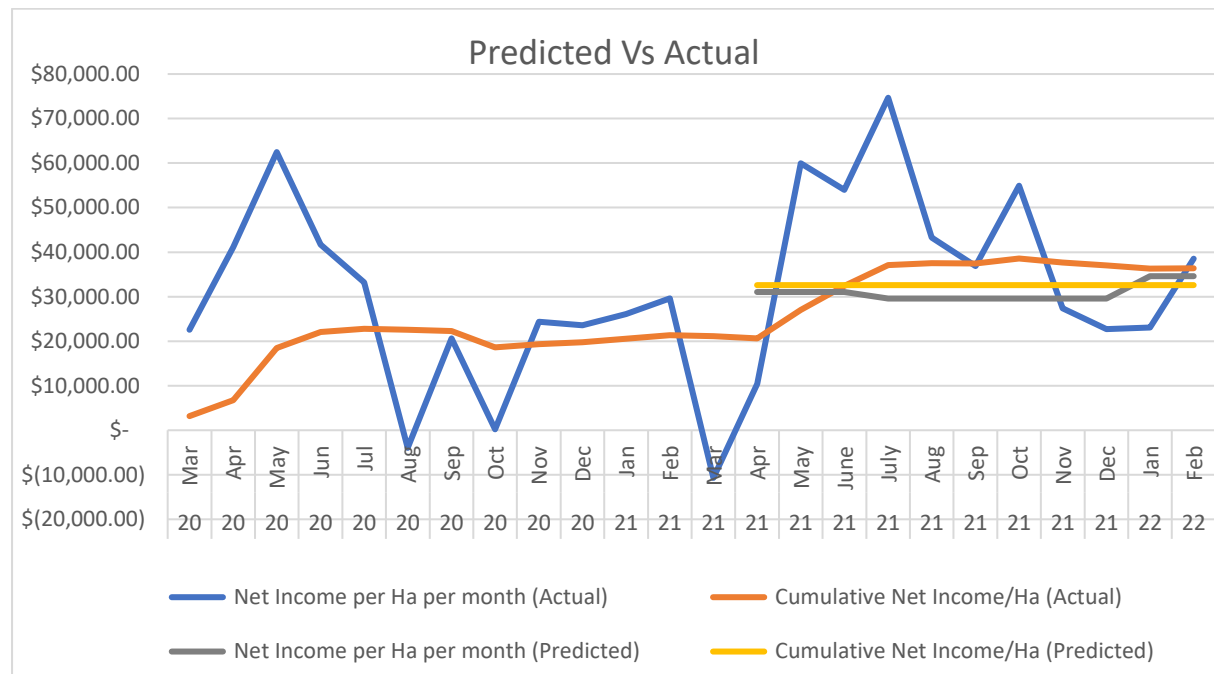


Chart 2: Actual vs Predicted

April 2022 Update

LOG MARKET UPDATE

Global markets during March have been driven by the war in Ukraine with all major commodities trading higher. Demand in China has been strong, however the recent lockdowns in Shenzhen and Shanghai have seen daily Chinese port offtakes drop down to around 43,000 tonnes per day – around half the normal amount.

China is still pursuing a zero-Covid strategy, and these lockdowns mean most factories, business activities and cargo movements have been affected. Log inventories on the Chinese ports are currently at normal levels, and any reduction in processing capacity is thought to be offset by reduced supply on the back of the Ukraine conflict.

Shipping has been affected by the increase in crude oil, which has undone all recent shipping rate decreases. As European countries ban exports of commodities, we are hearing that more of the bulk shipping fleet is moving into the Pacific, this could flow through to freight rate reductions in the medium term. In New Zealand, Covid has affected port loading capacity as most major ports struggle to keep a complete labour force. Log supply on the East Coast has been hampered by the recent weather events, this has helped to stop port inventories building with the other processing constraints.

Domestically, demand remains strong. The housing market has reached a turning point, however there is a huge backlog for timber to complete the existing consented builds. Consents were the highest on record for the first part of this year.

Log prices are expected to lift slightly in April/May, however external pressures around freight, the Ukraine crisis and covid shutdowns may affect this.

FOREST ACTIVITY UPDATE

Stoney River is currently sharing a clearfell harvest crew with Quail Ridge. This will be the case for the remainder of the year, so clearfell harvest will be intermittent as the crew moves between the two forests.

DAMAGE UPDATE FROM MARCH 2022 RAIN EVENT

The forest managers have been on the ground in the forest, and commented, that despite the significant amount of rain that came down during the rain event last month, the forest has escaped relatively unscathed.

There were slips on the fresh earthworks on Glenlea Station Road and slips on Monorae Station Road, and some damage on Wairoa River Road. These were able to be repaired and cleared by equipment already on site.

There were dropouts on Putere Road that have been repaired by the council. Access to log production is unaffected.
